

CURRICULUM CROP AND SOIL

Up to 5 students may be recruited.

The selection of students is based on shared responsibility between the University of Padova and the University of Georgia.

Selection process:

A call will be announced in November 2018.

Candidates shall be enrolled to the Second Cycle-Degree Course "Sustainable Agriculture" in the 2018/19 cohort at the time of the application.

Students will be pre-selected based on CV, motivation letter, a written test and an interview.

Final acceptance of the students is responsibility of the University of Georgia.

Additional admission requirements to be achieved before 15th April 2019:

1. English Language Proficiency Requirement:

Students whose primary language is not English must submit official TOEFL or IELTS scores that are not more than two years old.

If submitting the TOEFL: a minimum score of 550 (paper-based) or overall score of 80 on the Internet Based Test (IBT) with at least 20 on speaking and 20 on writing. If submitting the IELTS: a minimum overall band-width of 6.5, with no single band (score) below 6.0.

Students who have received degrees from institutions in countries where English is the primary language usually are not required to submit the TOEFL (or IELTS) scores unless the degree was received more than two years prior to application to the Graduate School.

2. Entrance Test Score GRE:

Scores on the Verbal and Quantitative sections of the General Test of the Graduate Record Examinations (GRE) are required (minimum score 300).

The general test of the GRE is offered year-round as a computer-based test at centers worldwide. Advance registration for tests is required. Information on the GRE can be obtained from the following sources:

All applicants must provide an active e-mail address for contact regarding application processing. Official acceptance is conveyed to the applicant in a formal letter issued by the Office of Graduate Admissions.

The following items have to be submitted for admission:

1. *Graduate School application form*

2. *Unofficial Transcripts and Academic Records from each institution you attended.* Official transcripts will be required after the admission; proof of degree conferred and date must be clearly indicated.

3. *Official TOEFL or IELTS scores.* They must be sent by the testing agency to the Office of

Graduate Admissions directly by the responsible testing agency. UGA institutional code for ETS reporting is 5813.

4. *Entrance test score (GRE)*. In addition to self-reported scores, Entrance Test Score must be sent to the Office of Graduate Admissions directly by the responsible testing agency. UGA institutional code for ETS reporting is 5813. Please note that listing UGA (ETS school code: 5813) as an Undergraduate Institution is NOT sufficient for ETS to send UGA a copy of the score report. You MUST list UGA (5813) as an actual Score Recipient.

5. *Three letters of recommendation in support of the application for admission*.

List the names of recommenders in the fields on page three of the application along with their e-mail addresses. They will receive a link to access a secure page where they can submit your recommendation quickly and easily via the Web.

Students may receive financial aid in the form of 40%-time assistantships, that currently pay \$18,078. All students on assistantship receive out-of-state tuition waivers and in-state fee reductions. Reduced in-state tuition (\$25) and incidental fees amount to approximately \$1,154/semester in fall and spring semesters and \$892 in summer semester. Students on 40%-time assistantships are expected to work an average of 16 hours per week over and beyond the work required to earn credits.

In addition, all students on graduate assistantships are required to enroll in a mandatory health insurance program that is partially subsidized by the University. Requirements to award degrees from UNIPD and UGA:

2. To pass each exam with a minimum grade of B at UGA and 25/30 at UNIPD.
