## School of Agricultural Sciences and Veterinary Medicine (AMV School) Guidelines for the second semester a.y. 2021/22

- 1. The teaching methods for the second semester will remain substantially unchanged. Therefore, please refer to the guidelines for the first semester published by the University: https://www.unipd.it/sites/unipd.it/files/2022/EducationalProcedures2nd-3rd-trimester-2nd-semester-2022.pdf
- 2. As regards teaching, the courses of the second semester and the second and third trimester of the academic year 2021/22, for all BA, MA and single-cycle degree courses, will be carried out as follows:
  - a) courses will be delivered simultaneously face to face and online; teachers can decide to made available the recordings of the lessons through the University platforms;
  - b) the experiential teachings (for example workshops, exercises and other practical activities) will be delivered exclusively in person.
- 3. Only online teaching is not allowed; this modality can however be considered in specific conditions (international teachers, fragile teachers with particular pathologies, teachers in isolation or quarantine) provided that the teaching effectiveness is maintained and that there are no negative implications on the actual possibility that the student can follow remotely (e.g. schedules consecutive to other activities carried out in presence). In case of criticality, please report the problem to the AMV School.
- 4. At the discretion of the teacher, students may be allowed to make an audio recording of the lesson.
- 5. Starting from 13<sup>th</sup> of September 2021, all students are required to complete the declaration of access to university facilities (<a href="https://accessostrutture.unipd.it">https://accessostrutture.unipd.it</a>).
- 6. Student tracking: teachers must project the QRcode generated by EasyBadge by entering <u>Authentication portal (unipd.it)</u>. Students are required to download and use the OrariUnipd app, noting the seat (if present in the classroom) or the XX code (if connected online). The procedure is the same for checking attendance for the courses which require it to be mandatory.
- 7. The Green Pass is mandatory for all persons present in the structures to any training activity provided by the University, such as for example students enrolled in degree courses, students enrolled in post-graduate courses, incoming students involved in international exchange programs, participants in university masters and teacher training programs, speakers invited to supplementary educational seminars, etc.
- 8. Verification of the Green Pass will be carried out by the staff of the Agripolis Multifunctional Hub. Sample checks will be carried out in the internal and external areas of the *Pentagono*, the *Ca' Gialla*, the ground floor classrooms of *Stecca 1 and Stecca 2* and the veterinary medicine classrooms *1, 2 and 3* of the Agripolis Campus, and in the complex of the "Ex Benedictine Court" of Legnaro.
- 9. The teacher is not obliged to check the Green Pass, but can do so at his discretion using the "VerificationC19" app.
- 10. Students are required to wear masks during lessons. The teacher is not obliged to wear a mask if he remains at a safe distance (> 2 m) from the students. At the end of each lesson the classrooms will be ventilated; sanitation will be carried out daily.
- 11. Students who have not yet enrolled in the MA degree programs and who are not able to access Moodle as they do not yet have their institutional email and login credentials: teachers can send the zoom link of their lessons and share the teaching material in a google drive folder.

## Note:

After March 31, 2022, should the state of emergency end, the rules relating to COVID containment measures (Green Pass, masks, etc.) could be reviewed; nevertheless, the method of teaching will in any case remain the one described above.
